GBM: General Body Meeting:

I would like to begin by thanking Savana residents for their participation in both GBMs that were held, first one on 01-Nov & second one on 22-Nov. As per society bye-laws, first GBM got adjourned due to lack of quorum (40%) but we achieved quorum (25%) during our 2nd meet. With that, our agendas, 'membership drive' & 'CAM handover initiation' were approved by majority. It is my onus now to drive these agendas forward. Thank you again for bestowing faith in current SWA.

Security-App: Safety & Security of Savana Residents are key moto of current SWA. In order to strengthen security within society and provide facilities management without putting any financial burden on SWA, as we are passing through Financial crunch, we have approved use of in-house Smart Savana security app that has been developed by few considerate residents. The security app is in trail phase by volunteers & would be launched after approval from Collegium.

Electricity Issue: As you are aware that possible supply of electricity from RPS Palm to SAVANA has been disconnected by DHBVN, therefore we have left with limited source of mains electricity supply from government department. We are in touch with RPS for early connection of electricity for SAVANA. *Covid-19:* The Covd-19 battle is still ongoing. Post festivities we have seen increase of +ve covid cases in our society. JLL is readily sanitizing towers & floors where +ve cases are there. Also, we have separate covid whatsApp group run by noble residents who offer guidance to +ve covid cases & assist with other help like oxygen cylinders, oximeters, etc. My humble request is that residents continue to follow the three main precautionary measures: wear masks, maintain social distance & wash/sanitize hands on regular basis.

Lastly, I would like to assure you all that SWA office bearers are often having meetings with RPS/CH/JLL. It is our endeavour to find amicable solution for all burning issues in society.

2. General Body Meeting



The first General Body Meeting (GBM) of SWA-3 was held on 01-Nov-2020, at central park. The notice of same was put on Tower notice boards by 15-Oct. Following were agendas of the GBM -

- a) GBM Approval for "Renewal of Membership as well as New Membership for 5 Years"
- b) GBM Approval for *"Takeover of CAM from maintenance agency M/s ClarieHeights"* except Electricity and other incomplete Infrastructure.
- c) Progress update by President on various issues

GBM (01-Nov):

As per clause 14 of SAVANA Bye-laws, "*The quorum for every general meeting, annual or special, Collegium, governing body shall be 40% of the members entitled to vote are present*". During GBM (01-Nov) attendance was little less than 9.5% i.e. almost 100 resident members were present in the meeting. Due to non fulfilment of Quorum, GBM (01-Nov) stood adjourned in line with clause 15 of SAVANA Bye-laws.

GBM (22-Nov):

Due to festival season, the second GBM could not be called earlier & so was scheduled to 22-Nov-2020. This 2nd GBM was attended by Savana residents in large numbers. Attached pics are testimony to it.

For 2nd GBM, as per Clause 15 of SAVANA Byelaws, "*If no quorum is present in the re-convened meeting, a total of 25% of members present shall constitute the quorum and the matters decided*".

During GBM (22-Nov), greater than 26% quorum was attained i.e. approx. 276 members were present. Almost 97% votes favored approval of both agendas.

Membership drive to soon begin in Dec-2020. On CAM handover, Mr. President clarified that -

- a) Consultant will be hired by SWA who can help SWA to prepare for SWA in terms of punch points, pending infrastructure work, handover readiness
- b) Necessary cost approval to hire consultant shall be obtained from Collegium
- c) Before SWA formally takeover CAM, all details (based on Consultant recommendation and reports) shall be presented to GBM for final approval

SWA office bearers esp. President addressed on-spot questions from residents, and also shared updates on ongoing burning issues of society like electricity, basement issues, STP, monkey menace etc.

Special guest at GBM (22-Nov) was ASI of much-acclaimed fame, whose current role is to raise awareness among public on social issues & traffic rules. He enthralled savanna residents with some rustic jokes and raised awareness on usage of electric bikes, respect for elders/parents, woman helpline number, blood donation camps & so on.

Notes:

- Before start of any commercial event or activity by any resident, a detailed proposal shall come to commercial committee for its evaluation. After receipt of proposal, a scrutiny shall be done by the committee w.r.t. its nature, timing and area required for that activity. Any activity can be taken up by a resident in the common area of the premises only after NOC of SWA.
- For weekdays, a discount of 10% shall be offered to the vendors for canopies/vans /events etc.
- A format of NOC shall be prepared by commercial committee.
- A flat discount of 10% shall be offered to the Savana residents for canopy.
- The above rates are liable to change from time to time based on demands.
- Charges for stalls during festival celebrations shall be discussed and decided later.
